## UPPER SCHOOL - Spring 2023

<b>English</b> In English this term, we will be focussing on the key areas of learning the children need to secure ready for next year. After Easter, we will begin our unit on the book War of the Worlds! We will explore the text first before writing a newspaper story and an explanation text. In guided reading, we will continue to work through the reading domains and learn how to use the text to support our inferences and make links and connections between words and text. We will be investigating a range of non-fiction texts. Reading for pleasure will continue to be a key aspect of our learning and the children will experience a range of different activities such as listening to a class reader, DEAR (Drop everything and read) and class reading cafes. In year 5 maths, we will continue to work on formal calculation strategies for all 4 operations. We will be learning; how to use a protractor to measure angles accurately, how to represent data in a variety of ways, how to read scales and solve problems based on the data. Year 6 will begin revision towards the summer 1 tests. Focus will be on problem solving in all areas of mathematics. We will also continue to develop the understanding of arithmetic and ensure that calcula- tion strategies are secure.
