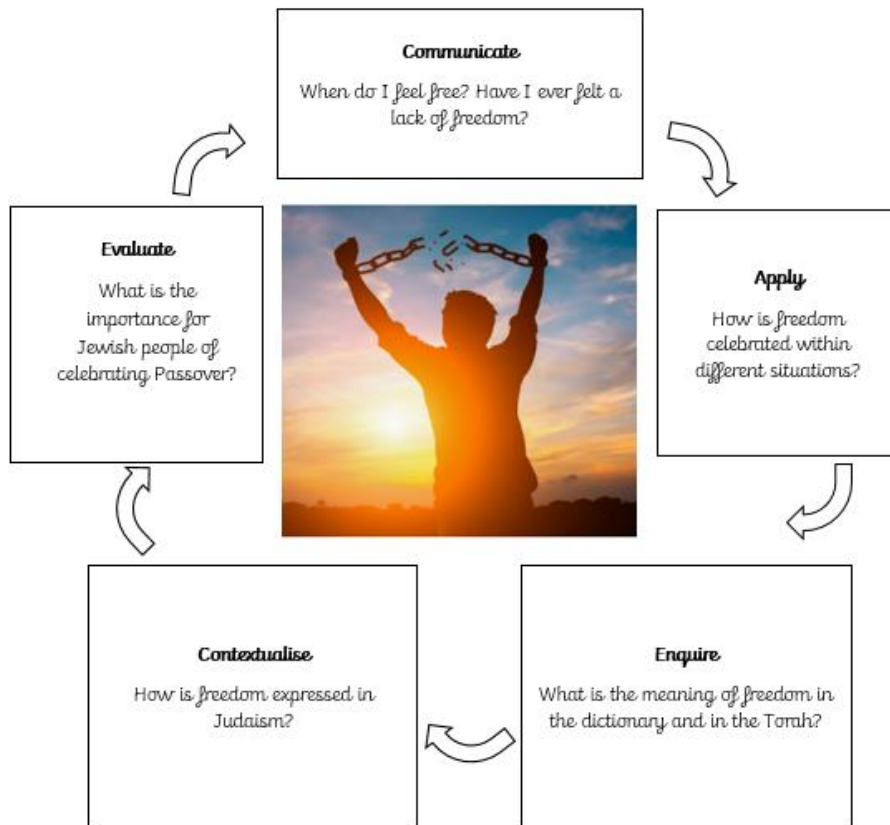


RE Knowledge Organiser – Year 4 Summer term 3b

Concept: Freedom



Key knowledge

- Jewish people still celebrate the night when they escaped from Egyptian slavery and call this Passover, from when 'their own houses were 'passed over' by the first born plague.
- During Passover they eat a special meal called Seder. All the foods on the plate are symbolic of this escape.

Key vocabulary					
Torah	Jewish holy book. the law of God as revealed to Moses (recorded in the first five books of the Hebrew scriptures)	Passover	The major Jewish spring festival which commemorates the liberation of the Israelites from Egyptian slavery.	Haggadah	The text recited at the Seder on the first two nights of the Jewish Passover (including a narrative of the Exodus)
Seder	A Jewish ritual service and ceremonial dinner for the first night or first two nights of Passover.	Slave	A person who is forced to work for and obey another and is considered to be their property	liberation	The action of setting someone free from imprisonment or slavery.
Haroset/c haroset	A dark-coloured paste made of fruits and nuts	Servant	A person who willingly does chores for others and is paid to do so.	shank bone	a large meaty bone in the lower leg of an animal
