How much home learning?

YEARS 3 & 4

Children are expected to spend about 2 and a half hours per week on reading, spelling, literacy, learning tables, mathematical problems or topic work.

YEARS 5 & 6

The amount and variety of home learning increases. Children are expected to spend 3 hours per week on reading, literacy, learning tables, mathematical problems or topic work.
