Reading Tasks

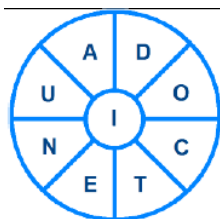
Write a new blurb for a book that has been read. How would you summarise it for the reader without giving too much away...?



- Read some non-fiction text and create a fact page. Think about the layout including heading, sub titles and pictures/diagrams.

Spelling Tasks

- Choose whether to focus on this week's Y3/4 or Y5/6 words posted on the website and select the correct PDF. There are two puzzles to complete – a crossword and word search. If you are struggling with the clues to the crossword (page 1), look at the words on the second page as these are the answers to the clues. If you are really stuck, the answers are on page 3 and page 4 of each PDF documents.



How many words can you make from the letters in the wheel? Each word must contain the hub letter I. Can you find a 9-letter word and at least 20 other words of five letters or more avoiding proper nouns?

Writing Tasks

- Your challenge is to write no more than 100 words for each of the prompts below. The first prompt can come anywhere in your writing.

With the second prompt, the words can be in any order but must all be there.
