Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Practise your times tables on Times Table Rockstars.
- Log on to the following website and complete the 5 maths questions set each day (Scroll down to find April). There are 4 different levels – silver is a good place to start but you can decide if you need more or less of a challenge.

- Get a piece of paper and ask your child to show everything they know about Shape. This could be pictures, diagrams, explanations, methods etc. They can be as creative as they want to be.
- Practise counting forwards and backwards from any given number in 5s

Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Listen to your child read and let them discuss what they have read. Encourage them to read with expression and intonation.
- Read science text all about toilets and then answer the questions (both download from our website). The answers are there also for you to check!
- With your child, follow a set of instructions to make something. This could be a paper aeroplane, a model or some baking for example.
