It could be a machine to transport you somewhere – real or imaginary, cook your favourite food or help you complete a task you don't want to do. Draw your invention first and label it with key words and phrases.</li><li>• Write an advert persuading people to buy your new machine. What does it do which makes it so brilliant?</li><li>• Explain how your machine works. This is different from simply describing it. You will need to use causal conjunctions.
