Maths Tasks

- Please, please, please keep practising your times tables and division facts. They are so important. Continue to use the games under Monday's home learning section.
- Log on to the website below and complete the 5 maths questions set each day (Scroll down to find April). There are 4 different levels – silver is a good place to start but you can decide if you need more or less of a challenge. If you need more to do, then you can scroll down to find questions for every day in September to December too.

- Complete the WW2 cryptogram puzzle. You need to solve the calculations and then find each answer in table at the bottom of the page. The letters should spell out the answers to the questions.

Reading Tasks

- Choose one of the wartime recipes from the attached file. Follow the recipe and once you have made it, review your cooking and the final product.
Was the recipe easy to follow?
Was your food tasty?
What would you do to improve the recipe next time? This could be ingredients or your cooking technique!
- Choose one of the reading comprehensions to complete. There are three different levels so you should only complete one. There are questions and answers for each level of text.

Spelling Tasks

- The root word 'cap' comes from the French and means take or seize. How many different words can you make which use this root word?
E.g., captivate.

Check that you have spelt the words correctly using a dictionary (or use a dictionary to help you find them) and then choose some of your words and write sentences to explain the meaning.

e.g. captivate
I was **captivated** by the beautiful view.
