

Maths Tasks

- Please keep practising your times tables and division facts. There are some practise tasks which have random questions. Try to complete as many as you can. The last one has some remainders.
- Log on to the website below and complete the 5 maths questions. There are 4 different levels – silver is a good place to start but you can decide if you need more or less of a challenge. You can scroll down to find further questions

- Angles in a straight line

Watch the video and complete the online tasks and taskon the website. Remember angles in a straight line total 180 degrees.

You can move the protractor, change the angles and hide the answers. You could practise using a real protractor if you have one at home.

- For fun: Complete the next “Family Maths Challenge”. You can discuss the problems with members of your household. Try to do as many as you can. Some are very tricky. There might be another next Monday so use the whole week to work on it.

As a rough guide of difficulty level:

- **Challenge 1 and 2** are suitable for ages 5 to 7.
- **Challenge 3 to 6** are suitable for ages 7 to 11.
- **Challenge 7 to 10** are suitable for ages 11 to 15.

Reading Tasks

- Keep reading regularly at home.
- Can you read and remember the names of places in the world. You could set yourself one of these challenges or choose your own. It doesn't have to be every one you might choose 10 or 15.
- I can name:
 - a. the countries in Europe
 - b. the counties of England
 - c. captals of Europe
