### Maths Tasks

- Please, please, please keep practising your times tables and division facts.
- Complete the Maths Challenge tasks. There are 4 tasks. Numbers 66 and 68 are more challenging. You might find drawing a picture or using trial and error might help solve the problem.
- Complete the Fluent in 5 challenges. I have posted challenges for years 4, 5 and 6 so choose which ones are appropriate for you. These are 5 minute challenges, but some may take a little longer.
- You could also carry on with the family challenge from Monday or do another set of questions from <https://corbettmathsprimary.com/5-a-day/>

### Reading Tasks

- Keep reading regularly at home. Try to read a range of different genres.
- Complete the reading comprehension "All about Garden Birds."  
There are 3 levels to choose from (3 stars being the most challenging). Only complete one level.
- Can you identify any birds you can see at home or at school? You could research more about other birds or animals.

### Spelling Tasks

- Choose whether to focus on Y3/4 or Y5/6 words and select the correct PDF.
- Complete the crossword (number 11). Try to do the crossword without the word list at the bottom to help. You might learn the crossword spellings and ask someone to test you.
- Try to complete one or more of the word searches or other challenges on this website. They put up new challenges each week.
