<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Please keep practising your times tables and division facts.</li><li>• Log on to the website below and complete the 5 maths questions. There are 4 different levels – silver is a good place to start but you can decide if you need more or less of a challenge. You can scroll down to find further questions <a href="https://corbettmathsprimary.com/5-a-day/">https://corbettmathsprimary.com/5-a-day/</a></li><li>• Your task is to research 2D shapes and learn their names and properties. Create a poster, flash cards or any other resource to help remember the vocabulary. This is some of the vocabulary you may include: polygon, triangle (scalene, equilateral, right angle, isosceles), quadrilateral (square, rectangle, trapezium, parallelogram, rhombus, kite), pentagon, hexagon, octagon, regular, irregular, circle, circumference, diameter, radius. Challenge: Do the same for 3D shapes.</li><li>• Complete the worksheet on solving simple equations.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Keep reading regularly at home.</li><li>• Complete the persuasive letter reading comprehension on the website.</li><li>• Explore the website <a href="https://www.lovereadng4kids.co.uk/">https://www.lovereadng4kids.co.uk/</a> If you are logged in, (it is free) you can read the first few pages of hundreds of books. Try a book you would not normally read.</li><li>• Find 5 unfamiliar words in the book you are reading. Write their definition and use them in your own sentence.</li></ul>
