I hope this newsletter finds you all well and in good spirits. Ethiopia class, we miss you and look forward to having you all back next week. In many respects, it has been a strange week. I can't believe we only have a week to go before we break up for Christmas. It has been unusual for me not to be involved in visits to the church, carol singing and all those other activities which make the time in school at this moment, that much more special. We have been trying our best to make things as Christmassy 'normal' as possible and we sincerely hope that your children are still enjoying their time in school.

The Outdoor Classroom is fast being constructed in front of your very eyes. I am personally very excited for your children with what we will have planned for them in the coming months and years! The most important aspect for me is being able to offer children a unique curriculum experience, which is of high quality and involves every child ... and gets them engaging positively and healthily with the great outdoors!

We have just received a £500 cheque from ASDA a part of their 'Getting Schools Back on Track' grant. As I understand it, we have used this money on providing additional stationary packs and copious amounts of hand sanitiser, which you'll be pleased to hear, we use a lot!

You may have also heard that the government have now reduced the need for 'close contacts' to self-isolate from 14 days to 10 days. This is effective from 1 minute past midnight on Sunday/Monday. With this in mind, we look forward to welcoming back Ethiopia class on Monday 14th December.

Thank you everybody who was able to fill in the online parent survey, which closed today. Below are the tabulated results. Thank you so much for all the comments, the vast majority of which were very complimentary. 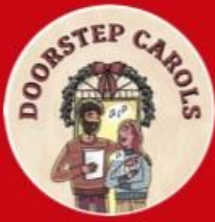
