Dear Parents and Carers,

It's difficult to start this, my first newsletter of the new academic year. On the one hand, I have been buoyed by the return to school and the mixture of excitement and nerves that a new school year brings. To see your children look so smart, so bright eyed, so expectant. To be out on the playground and to hear the happy shouts and to see children playing so well together. To visit classrooms and see your children happy, focussed and eager to learn and to show their best. All of this I have happily witnessed throughout the week, and so despite the first week back always being tiring for everyone, I was expecting to be writing to you with a broad and satisfied smile on my face.

The unfortunate and deeply sad news of our Queen passing has however, left an empty feeling in myself. Our recent Jubilee celebrations were a timely reminder that her life as our Queen was one of service, duty and sacrifice. For the vast majority of us, we will have never known a time without our Queen and it will take some time to be able to process, in our own way, the sense of loss. As one commentator noted, although many of us did not know the Queen personally, it felt as if we did. As my earlier communication to you all noted, we will support your children through this moment in our nation's history; to listen to their thoughts and feelings and to be a source of support if and when needed. Even when you think news like this might not affect you, it can sometimes trigger a sense of loss about moments in your life where you have lost something or someone. On Monday, we will be holding two special assemblies to mark the Queen's passing and her legacy to our nation and beyond.

Thank you for your efforts in making sure your child has been to ready to return to school. This includes making sure they are in the correct school uniform, including PE kit. As a reminder, we only allow small stud earrings and the wearing of non-smart watches. Thank you for your continued cooperation in supporting the school's uniform policy.

As some of you may remember, we are keen on holding an Open Classroom event. We had hoped for it to be next week, but we have had to push it back one week. Open Classroom will now be on Tuesday 20th September for Upper School parents, beginning at 2.45pm in the school hall. And then for Lower School parents on Thursday 22nd September, beginning at 2.45pm once again in the school hall. The event will allow you to hear some key information delivered by Mr Stapleton and Mrs Marks, along with their teaching teams. It will also give you the opportunity to informally be taken by your child into their new classroom to have a look round and to see what they have been up to in their first few weeks back.

The opportunity to discuss how your child has settled in to school will be reserved for the following week, when we will be holding our first parents' evenings of the year on Wednesday 28th and Thursday 29th September. The Wednesday offering will be for a face-to-face meeting in school and the Thursday offer will be a virtual offer, via MS Teams.

Many of you who have been dropping off or collecting your child from school, will have seen that many of the trees in our orchard are displaying very ripened fruit. Miss Halford will be harvesting the fruit next week, as part of the children's outdoor learning. The harvested fruit will be bagged up and offered to you after school as you collect. If you











would like to make a small donation, you can, but we are keen that they are eaten and enjoyed by anyone who takes a bag and that will be payment enough.

If you're stuck for things to do at the weekend, then I can highly recommend the Dino Derby, held by the 1st Denmead Scouts Group, from 1.30pm on Sunday at the end of Kidmore Lane. I will be attending with Mrs Marks and look forward to seeing many of you there – the weather is set fair, so fingers crossed for us all.

A polite request, as we have returned en-masse to school, to continue to show respect and consideration for our local residents when parking your cars. In particular, taking note of the signed no-waiting zone in Old River. Thank you for you anticipated support.

I finish with a huge congratulations to your children for completing a very successful first week back. And with a heartfelt thanks for your support in enabling this to happen.


PTA – NEWS UPDATE
