

OUTDOOR LEARNING UPDATE:

This half term, as part of their outdoor learning, Year 6 have been or will be, finding out about possible dangers in their environment and how we can help encourage more wildlife. Mongolia this week made a Wildlife Radar! If this is placed in the garden with some dog food or meat in it, an animal may walk in, through the edible charcoal and leave some footprints on the paper. You may want to leave it there for a few nights but remember to check the food! Please could the children report back with what they find in your garden using email, a photo, a drawing or something of your child's choice so we can build up a
