"It was a really comprehensive calendar of events- far more than we were expecting given the COVID restrictions at the time, and we were grateful that it enabled our son to familiarise himself with the school before he started. I thought the program itself was engaging and managed well in terms of a gentle transition starting with the introductions at infant school through to spending time on site at juniors."
