



Sports Premium Funding Review of academic year 2021-22 and plans for 2022-23

Since September 2015 the school has adopted the Guidance and Template from the Association for Physical Education to improve the impact of the Sports Funding in order to achieve the following vision for DJS in line with the vision for the Sports Premium funding:

ALL pupils leaving DJS school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

The Sports Funding Objectives:

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport against **5 key indicators:**

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

These directly relate to the school's overall vision statement for 2021-22 which is:

We are committed to teaching and encouraging our children to:

- *Be happy, healthy, confident and resilient*
- *Have empathy, understanding and kindness for others and themselves*
- *Be able to show positive learning behaviours and develop a love of learning*
- *Be socially skilled and effective communicators*
- *Be prepared to understand, embrace and live successfully in our diverse world*

- *Developing a growth mindset for lifelong learning*
- *Offering a relevant, inspiring and broad curriculum, adapted to ensure all individuals grow*

What we achieved in Academic Year 2021-22: Total to spend £23,516 (£4,275 b/fwd & £19,241 funding)

Swimming outcomes Summer 2022: Due to moving back to single age year groups and COVID we have moved swimming back to year 5 in order to catch up with swimming that had been missed in year 4. Therefore, year 5 have swam for 10 weeks during the summer term May – July. We will endeavor try to keep the dates similar but this will depend on the availability of the leisure center.

Additionally, we hope that in the future that we can provide swimming for years 3, 4 and 5 so that the children get an opportunity to swim every year and to see a clear progression with their swimming skills.

Year 5 children in July 2022: 95 children, of which 82 attended 10 swimming sessions.

75% of our Year 5 children can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25m.

57% of our Year 5 children can use a range of strokes effectively.

100% of our year 5 children who attended swimming has gained water confidence.
