Dear Parents and Carers,

What an exciting week we've had, especially if your child is in lower school!

Over the course of Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday we took almost 180 children to Soberton in the minibuses for a River Meon, Geography Field Trip. I have to say, all 6 classes were brilliant in their enthusiasm, focus and knowledge. They behaved impeccably and not one child fell in the river! They all assisted in measuring the width, depth and speed/flow-rate of the river. They learned some new vocabulary and concepts – please ask your child about 'erosion', 'transportation' and 'deposition'. And they all played an active part in conducting 'kick samples', which is a fancy term for collecting river mini-beasts from the bed of the river and catching them in nets, before then looking at them more closely in trays of river water. The children caught and identified and number of different creatures, such as shrimp, damsel, mayfly and stone fly larvae, lamphrey, caddis fly and baby brown trout. However, the most impressive was definitely the Water Scorpion, which even Ross, our leader from the Rivers Trust, had never seen before!

I spoke to many of you over the days of the trip and you could see how much your children enjoyed the experience because of how eager they were to share with you stories of their river adventure.

Being read to can be just as important as reading by yourself. Children can access texts that they might have struggled with and therefore potentially lost interest or not understood as well. Try it, you and your children might like it!

And finally, Friday also saw the culmination of our Cross Country season with the final championship race held at Crookhorn College. Both our boys and girls teams produced another gritty and determined effort as they fought off the cold weather again to record a brilliant 2nd and 3rd place in the Havant and Waterlooville League. Kayli, George and Leo produced captain performances and were pleased as punch to collect certificates and medals on behalf of the team at the presentation ceremony after.
