... and can be found in the world around us. Year 6 took a more dramatic approach to reflect their studies of Romeo and Juliet, with street fights, duels, a sweet parting and more! What a great way of de-mystifying Shakespeare and of making it active, fun and understandable!





Staying with assemblies, wow! what an assembly for upper school with Dr Whalen on Wednesday afternoon. The ideas he shared with the children were mind blowing! He described the power of the super computers that he uses to model the creation of stars after the "Big Bang". He showed pictures that had been created to show the different types of matter in the universe - only 4% of which is made of materials that are understood. We saw the creation of a star with matter being pulled together, he described the ideas of black holes, spinning galaxies, the expanding universe and the possibility of other universes.







Such was the level of information he presented, we wondered if it might be too much for the children, but then he invited questions and what fabulous questions they asked! They were completely engaged and curious to find out more and it was wonderful to have an expert who could answer them even when the answer was "We don't know because........." As Dr Whalen has proved to be so popular and there were still so many hands up with questions, he has very kindly agreed to return to school at some point after the half-term holidays.

After a full day's worth of training for staff, involving visiting speakers focussing on how we can further develop and deepen our already rich and exciting curriculum, and how we can better understand children's behaviour in all its forms, we found ourselves up on Portsdown Hill for our final league race of the season. Both boys and girls have been competing hard against many other schools and it was tense final race, where both our teams needed to run at their best to secure a place in the medals. And they produced

their best run of the year! Which means that our boys team have finished 2<sup>nd</sup> in the league and our girls have finished 3<sup>rd</sup>! What a fantastic achievement! Proud of them all. We will meet after half-term, for the Championship Race at Crookhorn college, where medals and certificates will be awarded ... can't wait!

Coming up after half term we have: the remaining class assemblies, Lower School local rivers trips, Upper School Mary Rose trips, our parents' evenings, class and sibling photos, World Book Day (Friday 3rd March), Comic Relief and more PTA events.



We will also be participating in the NSPCC's 'Speak out. Stay safe.' online programme after half term. This consists of an online assembly for all pupils and a face to face assembly for years 5 and 6. This is a safeguarding programme available to all primary schools in the UK. It aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of

abuse in a child friendly way. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a trusted adult or Childline. The children will learn about the 'PANTS' acrostic, which stands for:

- Privates are private
- Always remember your body belongs to you •
- No means no •
- Talk about secrets that upset you •
- Speak up, someone can help •

In the online assembly, the 'Speak out. Stay safe.' messages are delivered in a fun and interactive way with the help of their mascot Buddy as well as special guest appearances from Ant and Dec. We have studied the content of the materials and are extremely confident that they are appropriate for primary-school-aged children. By the end of the programme, we're convinced children will feel empowered – knowing how they can speak out and stay safe. If you would like to know more about the Speak out.
